PARK & PARCEL! NEW PARKING GUIDELINES

In July, a new parking policy took effect to optimize delivery services within the community. In an effort to ensure the smooth flow of deliveries and enhance convenience for all, designated delivery parking spaces will be strictly enforced from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day.



To facilitate seamless deliveries, any non-delivery vehicle found parked in these designated spaces during the specified hours will be subject to immobilization by our diligent Patrol Services team without prior notice. Please note that courtesy notices will no longer be issued. This measure is implemented to guarantee that these essential parking spots are reserved solely for delivery drivers, who play a vital role in transporting items ranging from food to furniture, ensuring swift and efficient services to both businesses and the public.



Delivery Drivers are defined at WAL as those who collect items and transport them to their destinations. Delivery drivers convey a variety of items, ranging from food to furniture, and may deliver to other businesses or to the public.

New USPS Parking Spots

The Board of Directors recently approved a mail delivery system by assigning one dedicated space per building exclusively for USPS postal carriers.

These spaces have been strategically located in close proximity to the lobby, ensuring a more efficient and convenient mail delivery experience for all. Please keep these spaces available for mail carriers.



PET'S OF THE MONTH



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
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ARTIST OF THE MONTH

ATTIRE GUIDE FOR WAL SUMMER OASIS

As we embrace the joys of summer, we kindly remind everyone of Policy Resolution No. 13, which outlines specific rules regarding attire within our indoor Common Element areas. These policies are in place to ensure the comfort, safety, and enjoyment of all residents and visitors.

- A shirtwaist, robe, or similar top cover must be worn in all indoor Common Element areas, except in specific areas such as tennis courts, racquetball and squash courts, indoor pool areas, gymnasium, and locker room areas.
- Footwear and required tops will be worn at all times in the Market Cafe areas as required by Alexandria City ordinance.
- Footwear must be worn in all Common Element Areas, except for the Indoor/Outdoor Pool areas.

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GREEN RECYCLING SOLUTIONS

Residents are reminded that there are locations where items not accepted at WAL, can be taken to recycling locations within the City of Alexandria, and it's free. Here are some of the things that are accepted by the City. For a complete list of items, go to the corresponding website shown below:

Glass should not be placed in the WAL recycling bins. There are several drop-off locations where there are purple containers for glass recycling. Check the website for additional items that can be placed at these locations (i.e., cardboard boxes. paper, aluminum cans, etc.).

Household Hazardous Waste and Electronic Collection <u>www.alexandriava.gov/waste/household-hazardous-waste-and-electronics-collection</u>

The City of Alexandria household hazardous and electronic collection center is at 3224 Colvin Street. The hours are Monday, 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., and Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The recycling center is free to all City of Alexandria residents.





Hazardous Waste Items:

- Auto Cleaning Products, Car Batteries, Fluorescent Light Bulbs, Oil-based Paints*, Lacquers, Spray Can Paint, Thinners, Fire Extinguishers, Household Cleaning Products, Household Batteries**, Flammable Caulks & Adhesives, Mercury Thermostats & Thermometers, Garden Products, Herbicides, Pesticides, Ant Bait and Traps, Rodent Control Products, Insect Spray Cans, Pet Supplies, etc.
- Water-based paints (Latex) are not considered hazardous. DRIED paint cans can be disposed of in regular trash.
- Household alkaline batteries (AA, AAA) can be disposed of in regular trash.

- The City is not responsible for deleting computer hard drives or memories. Go to the website above for a complete list of items. Some of the items that can be accepted are:




