ARE YOUR WAL IDS AND AMENITY PASSES CURRENT?

updated ID, you may be refused admission to amenities as well as be unable to get an Amenity Pass to the Indoor and Outdoor Pools. Please stop by Resident Services during office hours to re-register if you have yet to do so.

GAZEBO RENTALS



Watergate's Gazebos provide a beautiful setting for residents and their guests to spend time outdoors within VA state COVID safety guidelines. There are two easy ways to use these Gazebos:

- Reserve a gazebo via the Activities Office. There is a \$100 Rental Fee for a single gazebo; \$150 for the double gazebo, or
- 2. Contact Patrol Services starting at 9 a.m. on the day you want to use a gazebo. If one isn't reserved yet, you may use it free of charge.

Residents may not use the gazebo spaces without prior authorization from the Activities Office or Patrol Services. All residents using the gazeboes must complete check-in paperwork before setting up as well as complete check-out paperwork before leaving!



SHUTTLE RULES UPDATE
