Panelists will address what long-term care covers, the difference between Medicare and Medicaid, real estate tax exemptions, and Alexandria programs for older adult homeowners.


SEPT. 25: GENERAL ESTATE PLANNING AND DOCUMENTS, 2 P.M.

SEPTEMBER 12 PUBLIC HEARING ON NEW FACE COVERING ORDINANCE

The Alexandria City Council will hold a virtual public hearing on Saturday, September 12, as part of its regular meeting starting at 9:30 a.m., to consider adoption of an ordinance expanding the current state requirement that face coverings be worn in most indoor public places. The proposed ordinance would require face coverings to be worn over the nose and mouth in all indoor public places and in all outdoor public places where physical distancing cannot be maintained. Limited exceptions would include when a person is age 10 or younger, when wearing a face covering would be harmful to the wearer's health, or when a person is actively eating or drinking. If adopted, the ordinance will be effective October 1 and until further notice. Failure to comply could result in a \$100 fine.
